"With Yvonne and Rob, the challenges were clear," says Carolyn Bushong, a

relationship therapist in Denver and the founder of CarolynSays.com, who counseled the couple via phone. "Rob needed to recognize his wife's desire for boundaries, while Yvonne needed to honor her husband's cultural mores. 'As Rob and I talked, he revealed that his primary emotion in this conflict was guilt. He didn't want to let anyone down.

But he was particularly uneasy about disappointing his parents—Italians tend to impress a high degree of familial obligation onto their children. Plus, Rob felt that Yvonne was overreacting-he thought he was simply adding her to his happy family. The breakthrough came when she clarified why she was unhappy. Yvonne told him, 'I feel like there's no us because your priority is everybody else.' Rob realized he needed to create something separate with his wife. Yvonne admitted that her driving emotion was jealousy. When her hus-band chose to spend time with his family, she felt that he was expressing a
